

From the desk of Pastor Tim Albrecht

Greetings Faith Church,

We begin a season of change with the beginning of fall. Summer has ended, the color green is replaced with many different colors and warm days take on a new meaning. This also means with fall that winter is not all far behind either, and depending on how you view winter it means different things to different people.

In speaking about a change of seasons, the United Methodist Church is also in a season of change. On Tuesday, September 20th there was an informational meeting about the struggles and changes that could be happening in the United Methodist Church, and Faith Church regarding the topic human sexuality, same sex marriage, the ordination of gay and lesbian clergy the authority of scripture, and leaving the denomination. Like the season of winter, these topics mean different things to different people.

A brief overview, for the last 50 years the United Methodist Church has been debating the topic of human sexuality at its General Conference which are held every four years. (This coincides with the presidential election.) The General Conference speaks for the United Methodist Church. So in essence, the Church speaks publicly once every four years. At the 2016 General Conference it was decided that a special General Conference would be held in 2019 to settle the issue of human sexuality once and for all. After that conference, an agreement was made for churches on both ends of the theological spectrum to leave the denomination if they wanted. That is, all parties were in agreement for an exit path. This would be voted on at the 2020 General Conference. Due to covid, the 2020 General Conference was postponed until 2022, only to have it postponed until 2024 again because of covid. In the meantime, some parties that agreed on the separation protocol have stepped back on supporting it which now has made things somewhat chaotic and extremely uncertain waiting until 2024.

During this time I have done my best to keep Faith Church Leadership informed that at some point we would or might have to make a decision whether to stay with the United Methodist Church or move to the Global Methodist Church. The Wisconsin Annual Conference has provided a pathway for churches to leave the denomination if they think it is best for them to do so. There is a window to explore this process and Faith Church has begun to look at this beginning with the meeting that was held on September 20th. While human sexuality is being talked about, another issue is ownership of property and building. Which at present is owned by the Wisconsin Annual Conference.

Beginning after church this Sunday and for the next several Sunday's there will be a series of videos looking at what is going on in the denomination. There will also be some hand out material to look at too. Later on down the road the will be a special church conference for church members to vote on this.

Please be in prayer for Faith Church and its future.

Theme

Don't worry, put your trust in God.

Object

A small, flat, smooth stone and a bouquet of flowers.

Scripture

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear." Matthew 6:25 (NIV)





Look at this stones. They are small

flat stone that can fit into my hand in such a way that I can rub it with my thumb. Some people carry a stone like this with them all the time. They call it a "worry stone." When they start to worry about something, they just reach into their pocket or purse, take out the stone, and rub it with their thumb. They believe that rubbing the smooth surface of the stone gives them a peaceful feeling and helps them to stop worrying. Isn't that silly? How could rubbing on a stone take away your worries?

What are some of the things that people worry about? Well, some might worry about whether they will have enough money to buy food and clothing for themselves and their family. Food and clothing are very important. In fact, they are things which we must have, but does worrying about it help us to get the food and clothing that we need?

One day a large group of people was gathered around Jesus on a hillside and Jesus began to teach them. "Don't worry about whether you have enough food and drink, or enough clothes to wear," he said. "There are more important things in life than food and clothes." Then he went on to teach them a lesson about worry. "Look at the birds in the air," Jesus said. "They don't worry where their next meal is coming from. They don't store up grain in barns. And yet, the Heavenly Father takes care of them. Surely you are worth more to him than a bird."

"And why worry about your clothing?" Jesus continued. "Look at the lilies of the field and how they grow. They don't work or make their clothing, and yet Solomon in all his glory wasn't dressed as beautifully as they are. If God cares so wonderfully for these wildflowers, surely he will take care of you. Why do you show your lack of faith by worrying about these things?" Does this mean that we can sit around and wait for food and clothes to drop from the sky? No. God provides food for the birds, but he doesn't throw it into their nest. It is up to them to go out and gather their food. God provides clothing for us by giving us jobs so that we will have the money to buy clothes. Sometimes God provides clothes through friends and family who give us clothes. We need to have faith that God will provide, but we do have to do our part as well. Just remember -- our part does not include worry! This morning I not only brought a worry stone, I also brought a beautiful bouquet of flowers. I want each of you to have one of the flowers. As you look at the flower, remember that you are more important to God than the most beautiful flower. If he cares for the flowers, he surely cares for you!

Father, we thank you that you provide our every need. Help us not to worry, but to have faith. Amen.
